Hello everyone, I hope you and your families are all well. There was a slight drop in mass attendance last weekend which may mean that some parishioners have managed to get away on a summer break. However, if you do meet any of our parishioners in the course of this week, please let them know that

- i. our Church has reopened;
- ii. the mass times remain the same;
- iii. that we are following the Government guidelines and taking all reasonable steps to reduce the risk of infection; and
- iv. that we look forward to welcoming them back.

**Just to remind you again that:**

- Saturday 6.00pm is limited to 60 people, with 2 metre social distancing;
- Sunday 10.00am is limited to 100 people but all **MUST** wear facemasks, with 1metre+ social distancing.
- Sunday 5.00pm is limited to 60 people, with 2 metre social distancing.

To give us an indication of the numbers we can expect at each mass, it would be helpful if you would go to the website and register your proposed attendance each week. Face masks **are not compulsory** for the evening masses because of the 2m social distancing. They are, however, advisable. People who turn up at the 10am Mass without a mask, will regrettably have to be turned away because we **do not** hold stocks of face masks. Hand sanitizer will be dispensed by the stewards both on entry and departure from the Church. The Government also requires us to take contact details of all attendees.

**Your continued patience is much appreciated and please continue to support the Stewards to ensure a smooth entry and exit from the Church.**

**Mass intentions:** We are now up to date with most mass intentions and, as always the Sunday, 10am Mass is booked for few weeks ahead. A lot of the other dates, however, are free and we are urgently in need of more mass intentions for the coming weeks and months.
