

Message from Fr Anton. As you will have heard, London has been placed in Tier 2: High Alert, with effect from 2 December. But the good news is that churches may reopen for communal worship from 3 December. Thanks be to God. It is important, however, that we continue to follow government guidelines. This means that we maintain a distance of at least one metre and ensure that face coverings are worn inside the church. I will again look to the stewards to help me ensure that we are compliant and I would be grateful if you would support them by following their advice. In the meantime and certainly for this weekend, I will continue to live stream one mass each day and this will continue even after we open the Church to enable those of you who are not able to attend mass, for whatever reason, to join in through Zoom. If you would like to do so, please contact me for details. I should also be grateful if you would pass this on to our parishioners and assure them that we will be providing a safe environment should they wish to return to the Church.

In anticipation of the reopening, we will need to ensure that the church is cleaned. If you are able to spare a little time on Wednesday, 2 December around 2pm, please come along to the Church.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), is a process developed by the Catholic Church for prospective converts to Catholicism who are above the age of infant baptism. Candidates are gradually introduced to aspects of Catholic beliefs and practices. We hope to begin our Programme for 2021 in January and further details will be provided in due course. But, in the meantime, if you, or anyone you know, are interested in finding out more, please do not hesitate to contact Fr Anton.
