

**The month of May:** as you would have read in last week's newsletter, the month of May is traditionally dedicated to Our Lady. This year the Pope has asked that it be "dedicated to a "marathon" of prayer, to ask for the end of the pandemic, which has afflicted the world for more than a year and to ask for the resumption of social and work activities". Every Marian Shrine around the world is invited to pray with a particular intention for each day. We have also joined in this and will be offering the Pope's suggested intentions each day when we recite the Rosary in the Presbytery gardens (weather permitting) or in the church after each weekday Mass. I do hope you will join us if you can. The intentions for the coming week are as follows: We pray "**For the entire world wounded by this pandemic**" and in particular on:

**Sat 15 May:** for all migrants; **Sun. 16 May:** for all victims of violence and human trafficking; **Mon 17 May:** For all world leaders and for all heads of international organisations; **Tues. 18 May:** for all doctors and nurses; **Wed. 19 May:** For all people at war and for world peace; **Thurs 20 May:** for all pharmacists and health care personnel; **Friday 21 May:** for all social workers; **Sat 22 May:** for all volunteers.
