The training session should last around **1.5 hours. We need volunteers to act as fire wardens and cover the 3 weekend masses and the daily masses.** It shouldn't be an onerous duty and hopefully we will not need to evacuate, but we are obliged to ensure that suitable people have been identified for this role. **If you are able to help, please attend this workshop.**
