First Holy Communion 2026 - completed applications must be returned by this weekend. Please post them through the Presbytery letter box. There will be an introductory meeting for parents and children on Saturday, 24th January at 10.15am. The sessions will take place on Saturdays from 10.15am to 11.30pm.

Confirmation 2026 - thank you to all those who have submitted their application forms. The sessions begin on Sunday, 18 January at 6pm immediately after the 5pm Mass and will last for an hour. There will also be a meeting for parents of the confirmation candidates at 7pm immediately after the first session on 18 January. It is important that parents attend this meeting.

Peace Sunday: 18 January 2026 - As the Catholic Movement for Peace in England and Wales, Pax Christi relies on your support to continue their work of peace making. The work of Pax Christi is based on the Gospel and inspired by faith. Our vision is of a world where people can live in peace, without fear of violence in all its forms. Rooted in Catholic Christianity, Pax Christi works with all who share our values to abolish and create communities of peace and justice. **We will be taking a second collection for this purpose this weekend.**
